1 Timothy 3:15 - how people ought to conduct themselves in the household of God

Contentment vs. complacency

Contentment: a state of happiness or satisfaction.

Complacency: smug and uncritically satisfied with oneself or one's achievements.

Both:

- 1. Find rest.
- 2. Experience satisfaction.
- Enjoy their status in life. 3.

Differences:

- Contentment thanks God, complacency 1. thanks self.
- Contentment pursues excellence, 2. complacency rests on it's accomplishments.

(Philippians 3:8-11)

Contentment in God not the world. (vv 6-8)

Contentment fuels excellence. (vv 6:11-14)

(Philippians 3:12, 14; Hebrews 6:1)

Teach contentment. (vv 17-19)

Godliness with contentment = great gain. (2 Timothy 2:22)

Content with food and covering. (Job 1:21, Ecclesiastes 5:15)

Value of wealth:

- 1. Sustains life.
- 2. Can accomplish good.

The snare of wealth:

- Temptation. (1 Timothy 6:11, James 4:7, 1 Corinthians 1. 10:13)
- 2. A snare.
- Foolish and harmful desires. 3.
- 4. Ruin and destruction. (Matthew 7:13)

Love of money (v 10) (Hebrews 13:5)

- 1. Root of all sorts of evil.
- 2. Separation from God.
- 3. Many griefs.

Application

Avoid contentment:

- Focus nonessentials.
- Focus increasing income. (Luke 12:18-21)
- 3. Focus - keeping. (Matthew 19:23)

Choose to be content: (Philippians 4:11-13)

- Focus current enjoyment. 1.
- Focus freedom from envy.
- Focus genuine gratefulness.
- Focus it's God's. 4.

Matthew 6:19-21

- I am grateful for what I have.
- I am satisfied with what I earn.
- I am generous to those in need.
