Not chronological

Discipleship - it's demands, cost, impact, and rewards

John Mark

Lived in Jerusalem

Mother - Mary (Acts 12:12)

Cousin - Barnabas (Colossians 4:10)

Invited to join Barnabas and Paul (AD 46) (Acts 12:25, 13:5)

Left Barnabas and Paul for Jerusalem (Acts 13:13)

Second journey - Barnabas & Paul (Acts 15:36-41)

Paul and Barnabas separate over Mark

Paul takes Silas

Barnabas takes Mark

1. Barnabas' investment paid off

(Colossians 4:10, 2 Timothy 4:11, 1 Peter 5:13)

2. Mark became a true disciple

Faithful discipleship, even in hard times, is a dominate theme in Mark's Gospel.

"From beginning to end, we will see Jesus preparing His disciples and then propelling them forward to encounter challenges they felt ill prepared to meet.

Following Jesus requires neither great intelligence nor heroic bravery - merely a willingness to do as the Son of God commands. Discipleship is a matter of faithful obedience.^{*1}
