Your action point(s):

- Communion is a great way of declaring the power of Christ's death, burial and resurrection.
- Christ gave his life to be a substitutionary payment for our sins for all those believing in His free gift.
- Christ alone is the one who paid the penalty for all of mankind's past, present and future sins.
- Christ's sacrifice is sufficient to eradicate all of our guilt, shame, and judgment allowing everyone who receives Him by faith to escape the fires of hell and enjoy the bliss of heaven.
- Communion is a reminder of how we are proclaiming that salvation is by Christ's blood and not as a result of our works.
- Christ's blood allows us to seek forgiveness and restoration of fellowship with God through the cleansing power of the blood of Christ.
- Communion is a means of remembering that Christ is coming again in power and total victory.
- Communion is an expression of our obedience to the Lord's command.
- The Lord's supper should be celebrated regularly to establish the habit of remembering the Lord's death, burial and resurrection power until He comes.
- Communion allows believers to examine their hearts and minds for purity of motives.

Ask yourself...

- Have I walked close to God this week?
- ♦ Have I acknowledged Him as Lord of my life?
- ♦ Am I innocent in my heart and life before God?
 - Have I surrendered my life to Him or am I holding back a part of my life for myself?
 - Have I offended someone?
 - Have I said things that need to be repented of?
 - Have I done something that is clearly a violation of God's word?
 - Have I refused to make peace with anyone?
 - Is there any hidden sin that only God knows?
