Context

**Suffering** (1 Peter 3:14-17, 4:1-6)

Unjustly (vv 14-17)

Lifestyle (1 Peter 3:8-13)

1 Peter 3:18-22 - middle

Content (1 Peter 3:18-22)

Saturday (v 19)

**Flesh** - physical death

**Spirit** - alive (Revelation 4:2)

Proclamation [*kēryssō*] - the public proclamation of the gospel and matters pertaining to it.

Disobedient **spirits** (Genesis 6:1-5)

Sons of **God** (demons) (Genesis 3:15)

Daughters of **men** (humans)

Victory (over death, sin, and the enemy) (v 22)

(1 Corinthians 2:8; Colossians 2:13-14)

Cleansing **water** of the flood

**Baptism** = association with Christ

Death (the old person), burial (cleansing of sin),  
resurrection (new person)

Baptism saves? (Romans 4:14)

The Holy Spirit (Acts 10:44-48)

Baptism ceremony

Application

We are **saved** by faith alone in Jesus Christ (1 Peter 1:8-9)

Baptism **reminds** us of what has taken place (Romans 6:2-4)

Our **public** proclamation - “*I am a follower of Jesus Christ.*”

This may bring trials, suffering, and persecution (1  
Peter 1:6)

Have **hope** (v 22)
